1. Call to Order & Introductions

Michele Giess called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. and began introductions. A quorum was not established as not enough voting members were present.

2. Approval of December 7, 2023, Meeting Minutes

Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting (January 4, 2023) tabled as there was not a quorum.

3. Treasurer's Report

Toby reviewed the Treasurer's Report through November 2023 as this was the last report approved by Finance due to the fact the Finance Committee meets after the Council meeting this month (February 5, 2024). This happens several times throughout the year. The Treasurer's Report for December will be submitted to the Finance Committee on February 5th then presented to the Council in March. Approval of the Treasurer's Report was tabled as there was not a quorum.

4. State/FCFC/Director Report

Kinship Closet has started off great. 7 referrals so far. This initiative will not be accepting self-referrals. All referrals for this program will need to come from a Richland County Social Services agency or school. Our goal with this program is to help support keeping youth 0-21 with kin if safely possible. This project is using some of the funds allocated for this purpose from the Strong Families Safe Communities Grant.

High School Emergency based clothing voucher program is going well. We've been able to support 12 students. A clothing voucher for \$175 to use at Kohls is provided to the student to have adequate clothing. No self-referrals for this program. All referrals must come from school or another Richland County Social Services agency. This program is for 9-12th grade students only. As a reminder, students in kindergarten-8th can have referrals sent to The New Store.

The Department of Children and Youth may be starting to give stipends out to councils who would like to start a youth advisory committee. There is not much information yet on this initiative. FCFC Director will keep everyone informed on updates to this program.

The Department of Children and Youth at the state level is also discussing how to support the local levels when loved ones are going through the reentry process after incarceration. More information to come soon.

Michelle submitted the SFY25 Administrative Agent designation paperwork on January 9th. AA stays the same for SFY25: JFS.

We are still in need of a parent representative. Please share with your agencies to see if anyone may know of a parent that may be interested.

RFP was sent out this morning. The RFP is also on the Richland County Youth and Family Council Website.

RISE update. The January event went well. There were 25 people in attendance. Thank you to Juvenile Court for hosting. Wonderful feedback has been received. The next RISE event will be at RCCS on February 14th at 11:30am. Lunch is provided by Richland County Youth and Family Council.

5. El Update

Julie provided an update on the Early Intervention grant covering 7/1/23-12/31/23. Julie informed members of the Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSP) completed during this period there have been 54 initial, 19 annual and 161 reviews. There was 1 error by a new EISC where a plan missed the due date by 1 day.

6. Early Childhood Coordinating Committee

This discussion has been tabled until the next meeting, due to not having quorum.

7. Love on a Mission (Presentation by Deena Hamilton and Debra Weaver)

Founded in 2015 by Deena Hamilton. She shared her personal story of why she started. This is a safe place for LGBTQ children in the community. They have multiple youth programs and meetings for sharing. Common teachings are:

- Zero Tolerance for Bullying
- Mindful Understanding
- Respectful of Others Differences
- Find Commonality in Being Different
- Self-Regulate
- Unconditional Love
