Teresa Alt, Executive Director was also in attendance.

1. Call to Order & Introductions:

President Joe Trolian called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

2. Approval of March 4th, 2021 meeting minutes:

Michele moved, and Joe Devaney seconded a motion to approve the March 4th minutes. The motion passed by a voice vote.

3. Treasurer's Report:

Carmen provided the February report. February monthly receipts were \$214,591.89, and expenditures were \$90,834.49 for a cash balance of \$1,980,590.80.

Sarah made a motion to approve the February report to file for audit as presented. Kevin seconded the motion. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4. Early Intervention Report

Julie provided the Early Intervention Report. There are 226 (+38) duplicated Early Intervention referrals. The EI team is looking to engage the families with three-year old's who are exiting throughout the summer until they can begin preschool.

5. Finance Committee Report:

Teresa Alt reported that the Finance Committee attended a Zoom training on Capacity and Infra-Structure for Wraparound Development. This is an effort to put the Council in position to respond quickly to OhioRISE and other modernization efforts for Family Children Councils. The Finance Committee will participate in these sessions for the next two months along with technical assistance calls.

6. Communities of Support Grant

Teresa shared the award letter with the Council. Although the letter is vague, it is good news that the application was reviewed and accepted. The Council requested \$10,000 for building capacity and \$40,000 for plans of safe care and residential after care services.

7. OhioRISE Update

Governor DeWine announced that Aetna Better Health of Ohio has been selected as the specialized managed care organization for OhioRISE (Ohio Resilience through Integrated Systems and Excellence). The OhioRISE program will address gaps in Ohio's health care system that currently result in 140 Ohio kids living out of state on any given day to access the behavioral health services they need. The OhioRISE managed care plan will fill in these gaps by developing a network of care management entities and by working with Ohio's behavioral health providers to offer new intensive coordination service for children and families statewide.

8. TANF Summer Youth Employment Program

The Council in collaboration with Job and Family Services will support up to 150 youth and 15 supervisors in providing meaningful work experience to low income youth. Catalyst also has a TANF contract for summer employment. The Council will work closely with them to ensure that both summer employment programs can reach youth and employers and provide meaningful work experiences.

Mark Abrams reported that the City of Mansfield will be participating in the summer feeding program at North Lake Park and Johns Park.

Nikki reported that April is Child Abuse Awareness Month. Wear Blue to work day is April 14th. Please take photos and send them to Brigitte Coles.

Bath time Success

Sometimes the right piece of equipment makes a world of difference between a challenge and success.

Gary is a little boy in Early Intervention who needs support to sit due to gross motor challenges from cerebral palsy. Once he outgrew his infant bath seat, there were struggles with bathing.

During a recent Zoom visit with the family, we talked about bath seat options that Gary could try. The family was most interested in a device that would allow him to be supported in sitting, rather than reclined, as many bath seats are designed to do. The Early Intervention team provided a Firefly Splashy seat on loan from the equipment lending center, hoping it would be helpful, and Voila!

This note from the family: "Oh my goodness!! Thank you guys so much for let-ting me borrow the splashy seat! It made bath time so much easier for me and way more enjoyable for him!! It's a little big for him yet, but it still did its job! He enjoyed being able to sit in the water and splash around. He kept splashing his hands in the water, and he didn't know what to think."

It feels good to give this little guy the opportunity to enjoy bath time and help with a routine that shouldn't be any more challenging than it needs to be.

Community Collaboration

- Coordinating with Imagination Childcare. I met with Julie Wurthman, Owner on 4/26 and we discussed how to make referrals to early intervention. Two EI specialists as well as our Part C mental health consultant will be working with Julie on training on supporting children to be successful.
